The photographs of the Belgian-born Bart Michiels appear to be plain if very beautiful landscapes: verdant fields, smoky mountains. But each is a portrait of a battlefield, its scars long healed. "Anzio, 1944, Yellow Beach" is a portrait of a lovely still breakwater where in 1944 British and American troops took the Italian beach. "Verdun, 1916, Le Mort-Homme" is misty and green, showing only the tracks of what might be tractors, not the estimated 700,000 French and German casualties.
